Caring for Your TrueDent™ Dentures

Your dental professional has prescribed you custom-fit TrueDent dentures. With proper daily care, they will last longer and serve you better. Follow these recommendations to keep your dentures functioning at their best:

When handling dentures outside the mouth, use a folded towel or filled sink to prevent damage if dropped.

- 1. Remove dentures overnight to rest your gums.
- 2. Rinse to remove food or denture adhesive residue.
- 3. Gently brush all surfaces with a denture brush or a soft-bristled toothbrush, focusing especially on the gum area.
- 4. The denture can be cleaned by the patient with water and a soft brush. After cleaning, the denture should be dried and not soaked in liquid. Abrasive or whitening agents in toothpaste can damage the surface of the denture.
- 5. Make sure to follow the manufacturer instructions.

Caution:

Using bleach, vinegar, boiling water, or stiff brushes can damage dentures. Never place it in the dishwasher. Do not use
denture cleansers inside the mouth.

Prevent Stains:

- Clean dentures immediately after consuming foods such as tomato sauce, red wine, beets, berries, and coffee.
- Avoid tobacco use
- Treat stains early before they set in and become difficult to remove.

Checkups & Adjustments

Regular dental appointments are an essential part of your oral health, schedule regular checkups with your dentist every 6 months.

When to call your doctor

- If your dentures feel uncomfortable, make noise when you talk or eat, appear visibly worn or broken.
- If you develop sores, bleeding gums or bad breath With proper care, your TrueDent dentures will function beautifully.
